Week Five: Prayer Diary

Daily Prayer Intentions

Tuesday 22nd - for Chichester Cathedral, the Dean and Chapter, and all who worship there.

Wednesday 23rd – that our churches may grow and reflect the diversity of the parishes we serve.

Thursday 24th – for our Diocesan partner, YMCA Downslink, and the young people they support.

Friday 25th – that all who follow Jesus may proclaim his love and salvation with our lives and our actions

Saturday 26th – that all people may be drawn to Christ and united in him.
