Racial Justice Committee (RJC) – Terms of Reference

The membership of the committee is made up of racial justice core group members and archdeaconry advocates appointed to help oversee and to deliver the racial justice strategy. There are 17 members, and they meet three times per year and when needed to respond to arising matters.

Bishop of Lewes heads the Racial Justice Committee with the support of two Racial Justice Officers (RJOs) as part of the Common Good Committee's strategy for the diocese. He has commissioned the following members as recommended by the RJOs to help with providing strategic oversight and be the steering group that supports the Diocese of Chichester in taking forward the Lament to Actions priorities.

Terms of reference of RJC

Composition

The RJC will be co-chaired by the RJOs in the absence of Bishop of Lewes. It will include the DDO, Cathedral Precentor, Development Officer/Member of Apostolic Life team, Communications Officer, Chichester Diocese Department of Education member, Junior RJO Ambassadors, Lay members, and Clergy from across the diocese.

Role of members

- Members of the RJC will be expected to attend meetings
- Promote role of RJOs and RJC in their areas
- Liaise with Bishop Staff team, Rural deans, local schools to raise awareness of racial equity and racial justice issues
- Promote the racial justice week and black history month events publicity

- Propose, review, and help implement the racial justice strategy for the diocese
- The core group will review strategy and policy following guidance from the national church then discuss with the advocates

Authority

The RJOs & RJC authority comes from the Bishop of Chichester and the Diocesan Vision of 2020-2025: More Open, More Converted to Jesus Christ, More Generous and More Engaged, this includes more diversity and inclusion. Drawing from the lesson by Jesus Christ to the whole human race of unity and recovery of God's purposes for us. The RJOs are part of the Common Good Committee where they will report the work of the RJC.

Meetings

The co-chairs schedule the timetable of meetings and plan dates in advance. They will approve the agenda for each meeting, which will be circulated 3-7 days before the meeting.

Budget

Expenditure should only be committed with the prior agreement of the budget holder, the Bishop of Lewes.

Review

The RJC will review its terms of reference annually next due in September 2023 and proposed changes must be agreed with the co-chairs and the Bishop of Lewes.
