

This seminar will consider how the Early Church in its worship and witness understood the coming of Christ as the unique manifestation of God's mystery.



Western theology has often been described as a 'footnote to St. Augustine.'



# **Early Christian Witnesses to Contemplative Prayer**

Some of its chief defenders were monks, who recognised that its teaching about God has profound implications for a Christian vision of contemplative prayer.




