Disability Theology: Theory and Practice course

In this course I will introduce participants to the work of disability theologians including Nancy Eiesland, Sharon Betcher and Thomas Reynolds. We will consider the various terms used in relation to disability, and how these have developed over time.

Within a theological framework, we will investigate ideas relating to what it means to be human, how we think about community and relationships, and how we 'measure' our own and others' value.

In addition to these theoretical considerations, we will explore how some of the concerns raised by disability theologians could be responded to in practice: for instance, how can churches enact a Christ-like welcome for all, disabled and able-bodied alike? How might we best 'be the body of Christ' when human experiences of embodiment are so varied?

What might the implications for our ministry be from these conversations between theology and medical science? What might we do differently, and what might we do better?


How should a contemporary understanding of mental health affect the way we engage in pastoral care, and where might we have something particular to add to the way medicine considers what it means to be human?





The Jewish tradition refers to Moses as "Moshe Rabbenu" (Moses, our Teacher), hailing him to be the greatest prophet of all time and he is referenced prominently in the New Testament as well as a leader, prophet, teacher, and ancestor of the faith. However, no leader achieves success on their own. Moses was surrounded by other significant characters who shaped and supported him on his leadership journey. We will see how they formed the leadership team that supported Moses to be the leader that he was.

Western theology has often been described as a 'footnote to St. Augustine.'



Some of its chief defenders were monks, who recognised that its teaching about God has profound implications for a Christian vision of contemplative prayer.




