Role Purpose

General

- To share with the Bishop the cure of souls in this place and to attend to our life in Christ through Word and Sacrament and pastoral care.
- To encourage people to know, love and follow Jesus, and to grow as his disciples in worship and witness to the truth of the gospel.
- To nurture numerical and spiritual growth, re-imagining ministry, and contributing to the common good, through leadership, collaboration and example.
- To have regard for the vocation and responsibilities of the clergy as described in the Canons, the Ordinal, the Clergy Discipline Measure, the Code of Professional Conduct for the Clergy, the Declaration of Consent and other relevant legislation.

Specific

- Co-operate with the PCC in the whole mission of the church, which is spiritual, legal, financial, pastoral and missionary.
- Support and lead the parish to contribute to and enhance the mission of the Diocese and the wider Church.
- Encourage and enable clergy and lay colleagues, churchwardens, PCC, parish staff and volunteers to participate fully in planning and decision making, tasks and activities to ensure that gifts and talents are identified and used effectively.
- Oversee the planning, organisation and conduct of worship, making appropriate use of available resources to give glory to God and to nurture the faith of all within the life of the Church.
- Oversee preparation for baptism, confirmation and marriage.
- Conduct funeral services and other occasional offices for those in the parish.

- Inspire, motivate and empower all members of the Church in their own discipleship, and use and develop programmes to foster this.
- Identify pastoral care needs, including bereavement support, within the parish's communities and ensure appropriate structures and people are in place to provide the necessary support.
- Nurture and develop relationships with all local schools and in particular ensure the fulfilment of key responsibilities towards St John's Church of England Primary School.
- Work to grow the Church younger through developing ministry for children, young people and their families.
- Make full use of resources and buildings in order to develop the mission and outreach of the parish.
- Encourage existing and new community outreach programmes and nurture and develop relationships with community groups within the parish.
- Be open to all people and discover ways to draw those on the margins of the church and the community into the life of the church.
- In co-operation with the churchwardens and the PCC, ensure that Church property in the parish's care is well looked after and maintained and take appropriate action to resolve any unsafe and dangerous situations.
- Develop your own faith and that of those within the Church family through regular worship, prayer, reflection and study.
- Maintain a balanced and healthy life style by attending to personal physical and spiritual wellbeing and needs, making time for yourself with God and with family.

- Committed to all-age ministry and to continue the efforts to grow the church younger. E
- A strong vision for the role of a community church in the modern age. E
- Able to manage conflict and to deal with strong personalities. E
